



1. <u>ANNOUNCEMENT:</u>

The Trials Club of Canberra, hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct the Howard Wallace Masters Shield for Moto-Trials at Roads End, Iron Mines Road, Gunning on 18 November 2012.

2. JURISDICTION:

- 2.1. The above-mentioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling NSW Limited (MNSW) who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number 22/12/31088 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National Competition Licences, and Restricted National Competition Licences.
- 2.2. The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's), these Supplementary Regulations, the By-Laws of MNSW and any Final Instructions. BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.

3. ENTRIES:

- 3.1 Entries open forthwith and must be received by us Wednesday 14th November 2012.
- 3.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Promoter, if such retention is approved by MNSW.
- 3.3 Only entries received on the official Entry Form that are accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 3.4 <u>NOTE</u>: LATE ENTRIES MAY BE ACCÉPTED AT THE DISCRETION ÓF THE RACE SECRETARY. ENTRY FEES FOR ANY RIDER WITHDRAWING FROM THE MEETING PRIOR TO THURSDAY NOVEMBER 15TH WILL BE REFUNDED.

4. <u>INSURANCE:</u>

- 4.1 National Capital Benefits Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 4.2 Personal Accident and Ambulance Insurance is the responsibility of the individual.
- 4.3 IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT SUCH INSURANCE COVER.

5. **MEDICAL SERVICES:**

St John Ambulance in attendance.

6. ENTRY FEE:

Seniors: \$65 Juniors: \$40 6.1

Family: \$100 (One senior rider and one or more Juniors living at the same address) Minder: \$30

- 6.2 Payment by cheque, Money Order or direct deposit only.
- Cheques and Money Orders are to be made payable to the Trials Club of Canberra. 6.3
- ANY FEES FOR DISHONOURED CHEQUES WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT. 6.4

CLASSES OF COMPETITION: 7.

The event is open to Expert, A, B, C, Masters, Veteran, Clubman, Junior < 200cc.

All classes are open to both male and female riders.

- Those riders who are 40 years or older on the day. Run over the C Grade sections. Blue nameplate. Veteran: Masters: Those riders who are 35 years or older on the day. Run over the B Grade sections. Yellow nameplate.
- Clubman: Will be run over very basic sections and is open to relative newcomers to Open Trials, i.e. novices, or those riders who know their limitations but still wish to ride an Open event. White Nameplate.
- Junior < 200cc Those riders who are under 16 years old on the day, or are riding on a Junior Licence, and who wish to compete over the easier sections. White nameplate.

<u>AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY:</u> All Grades - 1st, 2nd, 3rd place trophies. Best in Class Trophies will be awarded to Twinshock competitors.

The Howard Wallace Shield will be presented to the 1st placegetter in Masters.

9. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

9.1 To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each Class shall be Three (3). 9.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, will be at the discretion of the Promoter, subject to MNSW approval.

10. **COMPETITION FORMAT:**

The number of sections and laps will be advised on the day. Clubman and Junior <200cc will ride anywhere within section boundaries. Expert, A, B, C, Masters, and Veteran riders will be further restricted. Please note:- Scoring will be as per GCR 23.7.3.2 -Trials.

There will be a 90 second time limit applied for each competitor per section.

11. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for Moto-Trials Competition. 11.1
- 11.2 Multiple entry of the one Machine in the same Class of Competition is not permitted.
- A competitor may finish the trial on a machine other than their own, provided they have first obtained the 11.3 approval of the MA Steward.

12. **RIDING NUMBERS:**

- All machines must have a 200 x 150mm nameplate fitted to the front. (Headlights are not acceptable). 12.1 First name and surname to be printed clearly on nameplate.
- 12.2 All Name Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the GCR's.

13. **RIDERS BRIEFING:**

A Riders' Briefing will be held prior to the commencement the Trial and ALL Competitors MUST attend. Riders' Briefing Sign On sheets must be signed by the competitor as confirmation of attendance.

14. DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

By order of MNSW, random drug &/or alcohol testing of participants (i.e. officials, competitors, mechanics, pit crew and any other person associated with the control, direction and operation of the competition) may take place prior to, or at any time during this meeting.



15. <u>CODE OF CONDUCT:</u>

All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCR's) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Competition Meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and shall be enforced.

16. TIMETABLE:

Competitors must present their Competition Licence, (and Logbooks for Juniors), and machine to the machine examiner by 9.40am when machines will be impounded until the start at 10am. Refer GCR 3.4.0.3 b) for forgetting licence or logbook.

For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 8.30am, the completion of the meeting for the participant being at the completion of his/her participation in the meeting.

17. COMPETITION:


The number of sections and laps will be advised on the day.

18. <u>NOISE:</u>

All machines must comply with the requirements of the GCR's and the Track Licence.

19. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

- 19.1 There will be no lunchbreak, however catering will be by the Yass High School P & C...
- 19.2 Absolutely no bikes to be ridden in the area during the event other than by Competitors and Key Officials.
- 19.3 No animals permitted. (Guide dogs exempted).
- 19.4 Any change of Entry details on the morning of the Trial will be subject to a \$20 Fee. Please consider carefully which class you wish to compete in when filling out your entry form.
- 19.5 Please refer to attached map for Trial location.
- 19.6 If less than three entries are received for Expert (green splits), or A Grade (red splits), sections will NOT include those splits. Affected riders will be contacted at close of entries.

- 2. I/We appoint and authorise ______ ("Guardian") as temporary guardian(s) and custodian(s) of the Minor, whilst the Minor has entered and participates in the Event.
- 3. I/We acknowledge that motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport and participating in the Event the Minor, takes and is exposed to certain risks and dangers including that:
 - (a) the Minor may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - (b) the Minor's machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - (c) other competitors may ride dangerously or with lack of skill;
 - (d) track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predicability;
 - (e) the Organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of the Event are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time and/or events;
 - (f) any policy of insurance of or in respect of the Minor's life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - (g) there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of the Minor if injured; and
 - (h) entrants including the Minor have an obligation to themselves and to others to compete safely and within the rules of competition.
- 4. In consideration of the Organiser's accepting the Minor as an entrant in the Event I/We agree to indemnify the Guardian, the Organisers and each of them in the following manner:
 - (a) that the Minor participates in the race meeting at my/our sole risk and responsibility;
 - (b) that the Minor accepts the venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
 - (c) that I/We indemnify and hold harmless the Organisers, their respective servants, agents or officials against any actions or claims which may be made by the Minor or on his behalf or by other parties for or in respect of or arising out of the Minor's death or any injury loss or damage caused to the Minor or the Minor's machinery or equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
- 5. I/We release & forever discharge the Guardian and the Organisers from all Claims that I may have or may have had but for this release arising from or in connection with this deed or from the Minor's participation in the Event.
- 6. I/We declare that the Minor is medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Event.
- 7. I/We authorise the Guardian to administer or have administered to the Minor such medical treatment as may be required to treat any injury, damage or loss that the Minor may suffer as a result of participation in the Event.
- 8. I/We authorise the Guardian to direct the Minor not to participate in the Event if participation constituted an unacceptable risk of causing the Minor harm, injury or death.
