He has ridden in every Australian Title event since 1977, admitting to feeling panicky at his first in Queensland, but now proudly listing an 8<sup>th</sup> placing as his most memorable result.



Neil's first competition bike was a TLR250 Honda, purchased off Peter Bayles when Neil had never even been to a trial, but just had a gut feeling that this machine was the go. He generously shared the bike with brother Colin, and gradually drew in Colin's wife Christine to observe, their kids and Neil junior to ride, eventually outlasting them all. Neil will soon be notching up another trials 'first' as he is the only club member to be selected to officiate at the World Round in Ballarat next week. And who knows, Neil, if you look closely in the crowd, you might just spot your favourite riders, Eddie Lejeune and Dougie Lampkin, and they might just be lucky enough to spot you!

Undaunted by his very painful dislocated shoulder at the Carrick trial when taking a tumble off his Beta on a steep rocky section, Neil continues to entertain and shine at the pointy end of C+, stating that *every* trial is memorable, that's why he keeps coming back.

Neil also enthuses over his BMW road/trail bike when feeling the urge to explore further afield, and is never far from anything mechanical, having been workshop manager at Motors for 35 years, and now Jack-of-all-trades on the Bayles farm. In fact the Bayles brothers were *very keen indeed* to contribute to this article, but to spare Neil's embarrassment we will limit the damage to suggesting that you ask Neil about over-indulging on a nice bottle of red wine at the Simplot Annual Spud Dinner.


